## **Illness**

This is our school policy which follows the guidelines laid down by the NHS and the Local Authority. Please can we ask, even if your child seems as bright as a button, that you apply the '48 hour rule'. This will help reduce the spread of infection and reduce the risk of your child getting it again. Thank you.
